OUTLINE OF WORKSHOPS

Please read the proposed outline to ensure the suitability of the session for your needs.

(1) Refining Urgent Suspected Head and Neck Cancer Referrals	This session is in response to an increase in numbers of referrals to ENT for suspected head and neck cancers. The session will include a discussion about what are red flags and should be referred urgently and what does not require an urgent referral and how they should be managed.
(1) Lung Cancer Update	The session will focus on which patients should be referred on a suspected lung cancer pathway, including subtle symptoms and non-smoking related lung cancers and the importance of pre-referral investigations.
(1) Safeguarding Adults Level 3 – Self-neglect	This safeguarding adults level 3 session will focus on self-neglect. We will look at the learning from recent reviews and how self-neglect is a safeguarding concern in Stockport.
(2) Detection and Management of CVD in Primary Care	CVD is one of the leading causes of death and disability in England, with deprived communities at greatest risk but the majority of CVD is preventable through identifying and managing risk earlier. This session will show you how to find and use the data and dashboards available to your practice to measure the effectiveness of different approaches to detecting and managing people with high-risk conditions and also help you to achieve the relevant LCS indicator.
(2) Childrens Community Nursing Team (CCNT) and Primary Care	This session will outline the remit and aim of the CCNT service, who can be referred, when, by whom and the information required to do so. It will provide clarity on when patients should be referred to CCNT and when they should be referred to Paediatrics. It will also highlight the virtual ward service and how this can be accessed.
(2) Diabetes Management in Primary Care	This session will provide a general update around management of patients with diabetes in primary care. It will provide the latest best practice and will cover amongst other areas; navigating medication choices, injectables and insulin.
(3) Stockport Community Nursing Service – What Primary Care Needs to Know	This session will support the role of our receptionists and other team members helping them to signpost and refer appropriately to community nursing services. It will outline the current services, how they can be accessed and by whom. It will provide clarity around weekend provision, criteria for referrals and self-referral and how best to work with our community nurses to achieve optimal care for our patients.
(3) Supporting the Health of Armed Forces Service Leavers	This session will highlight why it's important we understand more about the unique issues and concerns of army veterans and their families when accessing health care, it will focus on the common health needs of this vulnerable group and how we can each make a difference in primary care to support them, including implementing the RCGP Veteran Friendly Practice accreditation guidance.
(3) What you need to know about Dentistry in Stockport to Support your Patients	This session will be useful for the whole primary care team as it will give a general overview about Stockport dentistry, how it works and how it overlaps with general practice and other areas of primary care. It will highlight the impact interventions undertaken in general practice and community pharmacy have on dental health and how by working together we can optimise the health of our patients.
(4) The Intelligence Hub and Primary Care	This session will introduce primary care colleagues to the Intelligence Hub which is your one stop shop for data and intelligence, a single front door for organisations across GM that support our health and care objectives to access the intelligence needed to support their work. The session will highlight what impact it can have on primary care and its patients and how it can be utilised in primary care to support the work that you do.
(4) GM Primary Care Workforce Health and Wellbeing Programme	This session will focus on what managers in primary care will find most useful both to support themselves as managers and what resources are available to support their workforce. It will include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Wellbeing programme update •Quality Improvement approach review of activity (QOF/CQC workforce wellbeing support) •Handling Difficult Situations – Caring for Yourself and Others with Compassion (training offer overview) •NHS Leaders' Wellbeing Programme (training offer overview)
(4) Primary Care Networks (PCNS) – What are they and why does it Matter?	This session will provide an insight into why PCNs exist, what they are and what they aim to do. It will highlight the range of staff that makes up a PCN, the contractual requirements they have to meet and what impact this has on individual practices in Stockport. It will also focus on the opportunities PCNs bring both now and in the future and will shine a light on some current PCN innovations and pilots that are taking place.
