NHS Greater Manchester is committed to tackling poverty and since May 2023 we have been working in partnership with <u>Resolve Poverty</u>, offering free training to staff aimed at exploring the relationship between poverty and health and the steps we can all take to make a difference. To date 1,262 GM health and care colleagues have attended the training.

The sessions are aimed towards NHS Greater Manchester staff and colleagues employed within Health and Care providers in Greater Manchester.

- Non-clinical managers and leaders (including senior leaders) with responsibility for teams, services or pathways
- Colleagues in clinical roles who have some influence over services/pathways
- Clinical/care professional leaders

- Improving understanding of what poverty means in Greater Manchester
- The role of the NHS and health system in tackling poverty
- Identifying what is already being done within NHS GM to support people living in poverty.
- Policy and strategic responses to poverty including the Socio – economic Duty
- Frontline responses to poverty
