

1. Purpose

To ensure that all repeat prescriptions are sent to the correct supplier and also that inappropriate items are not directed to a DAC

2. Procedure

- When issuing a prescription for appliances and medication, check that the appropriate items are set up to go to the correct pharmacy / contractor.
- Items such as; leg bags, catheters, stoma products, irrigation systems and wipes should all be sent to the nominated appliance contractor.
- Firstly check the item to be sent to the appliance contractors to ensure they have the 'DAC' box ticked (this then ensures they go to the correct contractor)
- To check this right click on the item and select 'Edit'
- The following screen appears, if the DAC is not ticked select it and choose 'update' to ensure this prescription item then goes to the contractor



 Before sending any prescriptions containing both medication and appliances check they are going to the appropriate pharmacy / appliance contractor. • As noted below the prescription for (Senna) would go to the community pharmacy and the appliance prescription (Conveen) would go to the contractor.



• If this is not correct, go back into the drug and edit it making sure the DAC box is ticked or un-ticked depending on the item.

Please note that on some occasions the system recognises other items such as eye drops, needles and test strips as being appliances and therefore the DAC box will automatically be ticked. In this case, as shown previously, untick the DAC box to ensure these are sent to the community pharmacy.
