Re: Antibiotic Prescription Audit

Introduction and funding

Antibiotic usage has become an important issue nationally and in Greater Manchester is divergent from the rest of the UK where we are using more antibiotics. Rather than come to practices with a request to reduce, the CCG would request practices to undertake a regular monthly audit of a sample of antibiotic scripts. Accordingly we have arranged a small budget to support this work for 12months. The audit is designed to review 5% of monthly antibiotic scripts and the funding attached to this audit is £0.05 per registered patient for the 12 months of the audit. This will be added as a contract variation to the GP Development scheme.

The audit

The final step of the audit should be performed by a senior clinician and we would ask for a RAG rating for the antibiotic issued (Red - not appropriate, Amber probably appropriate, Green – appropriate). An example of a Green would be a script for amoxicillin 500mg tds for CAP with CURB 0 or 1. An Amber would be the same script but CURB score not recorded. A Red would be a script where the reviewer cannot see the rationale for that antibiotic. A delayed prescription would usually be green. The audit should be very quick and it is not expected that significant time would be required to complete it. For reference the Stockport antimicrobial quidelines are accessed via the link http://gmmmg.nhs.uk/docs/guidance/GM-Antimicrobial-guidelines-Dec-2018-v3-0.pdf. The audit is developmental. We would not expect any practice to have perfect performance but by structuring the audit in this way, and asking that the learning points be discussed in practice meetings, we will influence our antibiotic use in a positive way.

The audit will need to be run once a month on the previous months prescriptions. The EMIS search then needs to be exported to Excel to get the sample to be reviewed. Instructions on how to do this are attached.

The audit should be returned to the CCG medicines optimisation admin team (email <u>STOCCG.medsopadmin@nhs.net</u>) on a monthly basis. Return of the audit will release payment once a quarter.


Antibiotic Search Instructions

4. Once the report has run Choose View Results


