



Primary Care Network Bulletin: December 2022

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Faecal Immunochemical Testing

As discussed in previous PCN Leads Sessions, the BSG guidance states that ALL suspected cancer referrals for the lower GI pathway must be accompanied by a FIT result. This will help with earlier and faster diagnosis by identifying or ruling out lower GI cancer. This is in line with national planning guidance for 2022-23. These changes are coming into effect in GM by January 2023 and referral forms are being revised to reflect this.



As a reminder, we have FIT leaflets and animations on the <u>GM Cancer website</u> to guide patients with the FIT kits.

Secondary care colleagues have been asked not to reject any lower GI referrals **BUT** it is very important to undertake these tests and ensure referral criteria are met. Dermatology Briefing for Primary Care

The Dermatology service across Greater Manchester is facing considerable service resilience risks across a number of providers. A briefing note has been prepared by Dr Sarah Taylor, Dr Stephanie Ogden and Ali Jones and was shared with all PCN Cancer Leads on 28.11.22.

To reduce pressures in dermatology, the Cancer Alliance will shortly be sending specific training materials related to identifying seborrheic keratosis with a dermatoscope, which should not be referred on the Skin 2ww pathway. Where this is available, please use Advice and Guidance and provide good Macroscopic, Dermoscopic and locator images so secondary care clinicians can give feedback and potentially avoid face to face clinic appointments for benign lesions.

Whilst the Cancer Alliance and GM system cannot mandate that no referral is made to a GM dermatology service without a prior face-to-face primary care appointment, we would strongly encourage GPs in GM to ensure this is the case.



Prostate Targeted Case-Finding Project- PCN Leads session

Our PCN Leads session tomorrow will feature the prostate case-finding project, targeting the at-risk cohort of people with prostates who are:

- >45 years old and of black ethnic origin
- >45 years old and have a Family History of **prostate** cancer.
- ->50 years old

Thank you for your patience regarding the search on GP practice systems that coded the family history of ALL cancers- the search is currently being updated across all systems.

We are looking forward to hearing from Shagufta Perveen, who will be speaking about the prostate case finding project Milltown PCN ran in Oldham earlier this year.

Identifying the people with prostates who did not come forward for PSA counseling during the Covid-19 pandemic would be impossible without the resources in primary care, and your role as PCN Cancer Leads, so please share any thoughts or concerns during the session.

The information gathered will be collated by GM Cancer Alliance and will be shared with locality commissioners.

To support the role of the PCN Cancer Leads, GM Cancer has allocated each PCN £3,000 and PCNs will need to invoice GM Cancer using the details provided to the PCN Cancer Leads.
