Skin Awareness Week - 1st - 8th May

The GM Cancer Communications team have developed social media content that will focus on how to protect yourself in the sun, how to check your skin and what symptoms to look out for. Whilst the messages are universal, there will be a focus on 3 specific groups of people:

- White adults 50+, male and female, from areas of least deprivation (this group is the largest group presenting with symptoms)
- LGBTQ+ community (specifically men who sleep with men or MSM) – where there appears to be growing instances of skin cancer due to sun seeking behaviour / sunbed use for aesthetic reasons
- Parents of children under 12 as protection is childhood is important in preventing skin cancer in later life.

Dermoscopy educational resources

Dermoscopy is a really useful tool when assessing lesions, and in primary care can be particularly helpful in differentiating seborrhoeic keratoses from melanocytic lesions. Using a dermatoscope can also help to identify vascular lesions and basal cell carcinomas. Labelling of FIT kit - reminder for practice staff

GM Pathology labs are requesting that GP practice reception staff check that a patient's FIT is **correctly labelled** when the patient returns their FIT to the practice. Feedback from GM Pathology labs shows that this step of checking if a FIT is labelled is highly effective at reducing the number of rejected samples.

Self-Referral Chest X-Ray Survey

Greater Manchester Cancer have been running a Self-Referral Chest X-Ray pilot in HMR and Bury since July where patients have been able to self-refer for a chest x-ray if they meet a list of pre-defined criteria. The end of the pilot is approaching, and the project steering group are starting to build and evaluation document with recommendations for next steps of the project. The steering group are keen to gather primary care feedback on the project as part of the evaluation.
