# 2. ACTION: New process for requesting paediatric bloods (attachment)

The request for paediatric bloods will move onto eRS from Monday, 9 October. Therefore the new process will be to upload the blood form via eRS, which is the same way a referral letter is uploaded and the patient will then be able to book into the clinic.

The appointment request will be triaged by an administrative member of the Paediatric team who will ensure that the blood request form is attached. Failure to attach the form will result in the referral being rejected and appointment cancelled.

- This service is available for patients up to and including 12 years of age.
- Patients aged 13 years and older should be able to have bloods performed in the GP surgery and not have to attend the hospital.
- If there are any patients aged 13 -15 where there is a clinical need to attend the hospital for blood tests, then please email the blood request form and the rationale for booking to <u>paediatric.appointments@stockport.nhs.uk</u>. The appointments team will then process the request.
- If you require fasting bloods then email the request to <u>paediatric.appointments@stockport.nhs.uk</u>. Please ensure that the blood request form is also attached. The appointments team will book the patient into an early morning slot.

3. ACTION: Please add to EMIS – Medical Examiner Referral Form (attachment)

Please add the attached Stockport Medical Examiner referral form to your EMIS system. You will need it as part of the medical examiner process.

The statutory implementation of the medical examiner system for GP practices has been postponed until April, 2024. The Stockport locality is still looking to embed all new processes ahead of the legislation to ensure practices are prepared for the changes when they do come into force.

4. ACTION: Prescription saving schemes for patients

Practice staff are encouraged to remind their patients about prescription money saving schemes. NHS England is trying to raise awareness of ways to save money on prescriptions, particularly with those living with long-term conditions.

- <u>A Prescription Prepayment Certificate</u> saves people money if they pay for more than three items in three months, or 11 items in 12 months.
- People on a low income could be entitled for help with costs or free prescriptions through the <u>low-income scheme</u>, depending on their circumstances.

Please remind patients about these schemes, particularly those living with long-term conditions and people living in deprived areas, where data shows people receive significantly more prescription items, than those living in less deprived areas.

# 5. UPDATE: Updated Stockport Black and Grey list

The Stockport Black and Grey list is currently in the process of being updated to align with the Greater Manchester Medicines Management Group (GMMMG) Red Amber Green (RAG) list. Prescribers are asked to refer to the <u>GMMMG RAG</u> list as well as the Stockport Black and Grey list while the alignment is in progress.

Recent amendments to Stockport Black and Grey list include the following:

• Capsaicin patch (Qutenza®) for licenced indications has been removed from grey list, it is currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.

Note: Capsaicin patch (Qutenza®) for unlicenced indications remains on Stockport Black list and as do not prescribe (DNP) on GMMMG RAG list.

- Cariprazine has been removed from Stockport black list as currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.
- Epidyolex has been removed from Stockport grey list as currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.
- Melatonin for licenced indications has been removed from Stockport black list to align with GMMMG. Note: all unlicenced Melatonin preparations that do not have a shared care protocol remain on Stockport Black list.
  Melatonin for the management of jet lag remains on Stockport Black list and as DNP on the GMMMG RAG list
- Nabilone for licenced indications has been removed from Stockport grey list as it is currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.
  Note that Nabilone for unlicenced indications remains on Stockport black list and as DNP on GMMMG RAG list.
- Pollinex® and Pollinex® Quatro have been removed from Stockport black list as currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.
- Ulipristal acetate 5mg (Esmya®) has been removed from Stockport black list as currently listed by GMMMG as RED, not for prescribing in primary care.

## **10. UPDATE: MMR eligibility reminder**

Please be reminded that anyone who has not had two doses of the MMR vaccine can ask their GP surgery for a vaccination appointment. MMR vaccine can be given to individuals of any age and should be offered opportunistically and promoted to unvaccinated or partially vaccinated younger adults, particularly those born before 1990.

New GP registration entry into college, university or other higher education institutions, prison or military service also provides an opportunity to check an individual's immunisation history. Those who have not received MMR should be offered appropriate MMR immunisation. The Green Book page 10
