Actions 1. ACTION: Be aware of measles cases in the north west	
	n Security Agency in the North West has been notified of a small number of confirmed measles cases in nester and Lancashire.
The cases are not epidemiologically linked, they had no international or UK travel exposures and they are not members of a community known to be more susceptible to measles. This implies that there are some unknown cases of measles in the North West, resulting in local community transmission.	
Please refer to communications from UKHSA and NHSE, reinforcing the importance of infection prevention and control, notification of suspected cases and unvaccinated healthcare staff. There are also resources available for health care professionals here - <u>Think Measles</u> .	

Measles is a clinical diagnosis, however as measles is not widely circulating within the North West, clinicians are advised to take an urgent diagnostic PCR test to support management of cases, minimise impact on close vulnerable contacts, the community and health care services.

How to take a sample for measles PCR:

- A mouth swab (ideally in viral transport medium, usually available from your local laboratory), or
- A dry swab can be used to swab the inside of the mouth, use the swab from a charcoal transport medium pack but DO NOT place in the charcoal transport medium. Please use a plain sterile container such a universal container used for urine sample,
 - or
- Where mouth swabs or dry swabs are not available, a urine sample; please use a plain sterile urine container without preservative.

Please send these samples urgently to the UKHSA Virology lab at Manchester NHS Foundation Trust, via your local laboratory. Results will generally be available within 48 hours of sample receipt in the lab.

2. ACTION: Patient leaflet with advice, highlighting risks of infection from a pet rodent

The Public Health team at Stockport Council has provided an information leaflet for people who keep rodents, such as hamsters, gerbils, rats, mice and guinea pigs, as pets. All rodents can carry bacteria and viruses that can cause infections in people.

Although uncommon, these infections may have serious consequences for humans. The leaflet describes the risks of infection from a pet rodent and also gives some basic advice on how to reduce these risks. 3. UPDATE: tQuest downtime affecting GP pathology orders

EMIS is upgrading the tQuest database for Stockport NHS Foundation Trust this Sunday, 19 November. The system is expected to be offline for a period of up to three hours on Sunday morning.

GPs will not be able to place electronic orders for pathology tests during this time. Users will receive a maintenance message advising the system is offline if they try to place a pathology order. Orders will need to be placed using the existing paper process for system downtime during this period.

4. UPDATE: Viewing prescriptions on the NHS app

Patients in Stockport can now view their prescriptions on the NHS app, including repeat prescriptions, and one-off prescriptions. They can use the NHS app to:

- view items prescribed
- see the prescription type (repeat or one-off)
- who the prescribing professional is

This will show patients exactly what their healthcare provider has prescribed for them and what they will then collect, or receive, from pharmacies.

Patients without a nominated pharmacy will also be able to view a prescription barcode in their NHS app. This barcode can be presented to a pharmacist without having to collect a paper prescription from their GP.
