If you are in receipt of Attendance Allowance or Disability Living Allowance due to a diagnosed dementia (i.e. Alzheimer's, Vascular Dementia or Lewy Body) you may be eligible for council tax benefit on SMI grounds. Please ring your council tax office and request an SMI form.

Any person who holds a current licence or wishes to re-apply for a new licence must, by law, inform the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Authority (DVLA) if they are given a diagnosis of Dementia (i.e. Alzheimers, Vascular, Lewy Body etc). Notification of the diagnosis should be sent with the person's driver number, full name, address and date of birth to:-Drivers Medical Section, DVLA, Swansea, SA99 1TU or obtain a form from DVLA either by phone or from their website.

Failure to inform the DVLA of a diagnosis is a criminal offence punishable by a fine of up to £1,000.00. If a person does not wish to carry on driving they should return their licence to the DVLA. (There is an advice sheet available on driving and dementia if you would like a copy). It is also advisable to inform your insurance.
